

## MMA Members Celebrate New Exhibitions

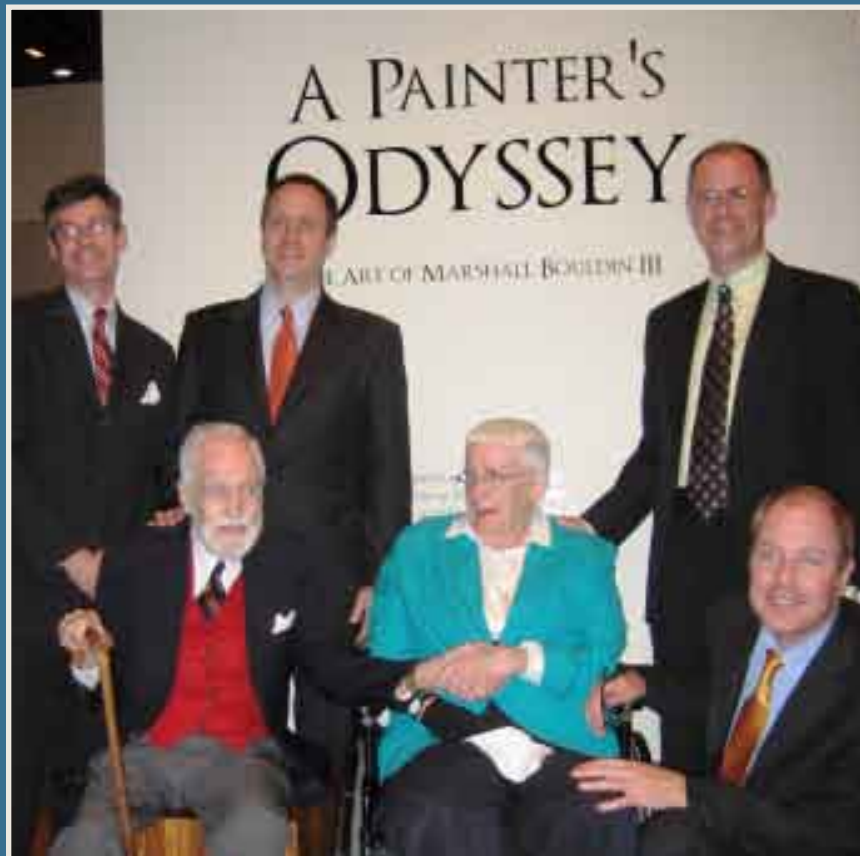

## Bethlehem Tree Lights up Holiday Season

In 2008, the Museum became the new home for the Younger Foundation Crèche Collection and Bethlehem Tree. Most recently housed and displayed annually at the Dixon Gallery and Gardens in Memphis, Tennessee, the installation features a sixteen-foot-tall tree and more than 100 authentic eighteenth-century Neapolitan angel and Nativity figurines in an opulent Italian crèche setting. The collection was inspired by a 1985 trip to New York City's Metropolitan Museum of Art by Mrs. Jewell Younger Graeber of Marks, Mississippi. After first viewing the world-renowned Angel Tree, Mrs. Graeber was so moved that she began her



own collection to share with the children of Mississippi. The installation premiered in Jackson on November 11 during a lighting ceremony reminiscent of the one held each year at the Met.
