**Mississippi Museum of Art Presents**  
***Rembrandt: Beyond the Brush***  
**October 8, 2011 - December 11, 2011**

**(Jackson, Miss.)** ... The fame of Rembrandt Van Rijn (1606-1669) as a painter was exceeded in his own lifetime by his renown as a master etcher. In an age and culture dominated by the intellect, Rembrandt's patrons treasured his ability to communicate the profound, spiritual beauty of the earthbound and the tangible. Today he is also greatly admired for his sensitivity to the psychology of the common man. *Rembrandt: Beyond the Brush*, a collection of etchings, is on view at the Mississippi Museum of Art (the Museum) from October 8 through December 11, 2011.

Through self-portraits, landscapes, and depictions of Bible stories and everyday life, Rembrandt captured the essence of man's feeling for the spiritual and personal, all portrayed within the context of 17th century Holland's dynamic society. Rembrandt's artistry is embodied in the 35 etchings that comprise this exhibition from the permanent collection of the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts, Montgomery, Alabama.

Museum hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 AM to 5 PM and Sunday, noon to 5 PM. The Museum is closed Monday. Admission to
