



Teen Council Application

The Mississippi Museum of Art (MMA) is seeking a group of dynamic high school students for its Teen Council. Over the course of the academic year, the group will meet and work with MMA staff to help shape the direction of how the museum engages with young audiences. Participants will learn about the museum collection, participate in MMA public programs, explore local arts-focused events and venues, meet artists and creative professionals, and plan every element of the Museum's Teen events, HallowTEEN and Night at the Museum, all while forming relationships with other like-minded teens in the Jackson-Metro Area. This is a fun and exciting opportunity for arts, history, and culture enthusiasts who seek to gain leadership and project-management experience, all while working with museum employees in a professional setting. This program is open to students enrolled in grades 9-12 for the 2025-2026 school year and will meet in person at the Museum every other Tuesday evening from 4:30-6:30pm during the academic year.

Mission:

The Teen Council at the Mississippi Museum of Art creates a pathway for young people to be a visible presence and (an amplified) voice within the museum as well as the community to lead the way for genuine human interaction, communication, and exchange.

Goals for Teen Council:

- Engage a wide range of area teens in programs and events at MMA
- Learn about MMA and enjoy the space
- Discover and create ways to be a voice and presence at MMA and to larger audience
- Promote and perform outreach for teens all over the city
- Create a platform to elevate teen voices at the Mississippi Museum of Art

Participation/Attendance Expectations:

- Attend at least 2 MMA public programs throughout the year: seasonal Museum After Hours, Family Day, Teacher Open House, Exhibition openings/closings, etc.
- Attend regular Tuesday meetings with an 85% attendance rate
- Co-lead an element of one the 2 major Teen Council events. (Leading requires co-planning and facilitating the activities)
- Be present at the 2 major Teen Council events: Fall HallowTEEN event and Spring Night at the Museum event

To apply, students must complete the application and have a teacher/mentor submit a letter of recommendation.
